What are we learning in 5th Grade?

Math -Students will use models and strategies to solve real-world and word problems involving multiplication and division specific to order or operations. Test this week!

<u>ELA</u> – Students will learn about monologues followed by collaborating with a group to Create a monologue. Students will review verbs; specifically, perfect verb tenses. Students will provide kind, helpful, and specific feedback to peers on their monologue graphic organizer.

Social Studies – Civics and Government – Students will explain how ideas of various governments influenced the development of the United States government (Roman, Greek, Iroquois, and British). Summarize the organizational structures and powers of the United States government (legislative, judicial, and executive branches of government). Analyze historical documents that shaped the foundation of the United States government. Students will understand the values and principles of a democratic republic. Students will analyze the rights and responsibilities of United States citizens in relation to the concept of "common good" according to the United States Constitution (Bill of Rights). Students will exemplify ways in which the rights, responsibilities and privileges of citizens are protected under the United States Constitution. Students explain why civic participation is important in the United States.
